

**INDICATIONS FOR THE QUALIFICATION EXAM
TO ACCESS THE LATIN COURSE 2**

The Qualification exam allows candidates to access the Latin 2 Course (TL1002), after verifying the language skills acquired in other courses of study.

The exam includes: knowledge of the five declensions of the noun and cases, the two classes of adjectives, the degrees of the adjective and adverb, indicative (all) and subjunctive (present and imperfect) of the verb *sum*, indicative (all) and present imperative of the four verbal conjugations in the active form.

The exam is divided into 3 parts:

1. **Translation**
2. **Grammatical Analysis of each sentence**
3. **Verbal Analysis**

- **N.B.** The use of a Latin dictionary is permitted.
